AMENDED STATE OF EMERGENCY

On January 13, 2023, I signed Executive Order 2023-029, extending the State of Emergency and certain emergency actions relating to the July 2022 devastating flooding in Eastern Kentucky through July 31, 2023 for those local jurisdictions that requested the extension. Subsequently, an additional County Judge/Executive requested an extension of the State of Emergency and certain emergency actions related to it.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of Kentucky and by KRS Chapter 39A, including KRS 39A.090(2)(b), do hereby amend Executive Order 2023-029 to reflect that 21 County Judge/Executives and two Mayors of consolidated local governments have written letters requesting an extension of the State of Emergency and certain executive actions related to it, and to declare that a State of Emergency continues to exist in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and ORDER and DIRECT that Executive Order 2022-457 and Executive Order 2022-460, as extended through Executive Order 2022-576, be extended until July 31, 2023, in the following local jurisdictions:

STATE OF EMERGENCY

Beginning on July 26, 2022, and continuing, a severe weather system generating multiple rounds of heavy torrential rain, creating flooding, flash flooding, mudslides, and landslides is impacting the Commonwealth of Kentucky; creating dangerous conditions and damage to public infrastructure, utility distribution systems, and private properties.

These conditions are endangering public health and safety and public and private property; and

State and local governments share responsibility for protection of public health, safety, and security as well as for the protection of public and private property and for taking appropriate actions to ensure the provision of essential public services;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of Kentucky and by KRS Chapter 39A, do hereby declare a State of Emergency in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and do hereby ORDER and DIRECT that:

- The Division of Emergency Management within the Department of Military
 Affairs shall execute the Kentucky Emergency Operations Plan and, from the
 Kentucky Emergency Operations Center, shall coordinate the response and relief
 activities of all state agencies and private relief organizations in response to this
 emergency.
- The Adjutant General is authorized to issue active duty orders for the mobilization of such National Guard personnel and equipment as he may determine to protect life and safety, to continue essential public services and to prevent undue loss and suffering.
- All state agencies shall coordinate any and all public and emergency information and/or activities/releases related to this emergency and the response efforts of state agencies with the Division of Emergency Management.
- 4. All state agencies shall provide sufficient personnel required for the staffing of the Kentucky Emergency Operations Center or other command, control, and coordination points as may be designated by the Division of Emergency Management's Director and shall provide such personnel, vehicles, equipment, and other resources needed to protect life and property and to ensure continuation, restoration and recovery of essential public services.
- 5. The Finance and Administration Cabinet is directed to provide assistance with incident/disaster resource management, procurements and contracting and to fund the urgent operational and/or response of the Division of Emergency Management and the unbudgeted expenditures and obligations of other state agencies that are incurred in response to and recovery from this emergency incident and in executing the provisions of this Executive Order.

- 6. The Division of Emergency Management is authorized to request assistance, federal, state, local, private sector, volunteer, and donated resources as may be available to minimize human suffering and to restore essential services to the general population and to assist state and local governments and individuals impacted by this emergency.
- 7. The Division of Emergency Management shall consult with the American National Red Cross and local officials to determine the need for emergency shelters for displaced families and shall coordinate with local government, school boards, and other organizations to determine the availability of schools and other facilities to be used as shelters during this emergency.
- 8. Transportation on and access to any and all public roadways in affected areas may be restricted or prohibited in the interest of public health and safety.

This order shall be effective July 28, 2022.

STATE OF EMERGENCY RELATING TO THE PROHIBITION AGAINST PRICE GOUGING

Beginning on July 28, 2022, and continuing, a severe weather system generating multiple rounds of heavy torrential rain, creating flooding, flash flooding, mudslides, and landslides is impacting the Commonwealth of Kentucky, creating dangerous conditions and damage to public infrastructure, utility distribution systems, and private properties.

Under the powers provided by the Kentucky Constitution and Kentucky Revised Statutes, including KRS Chapter 39A, I declared by Executive Order 2022-457 that a State of Emergency exists in the Commonwealth. Under the Kentucky Constitution and Chapter 367 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, I am empowered to implement certain provisions of law aimed toward protecting Kentucky consumers.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Kentucky Constitution and KRS Chapters 367 and 39A, do hereby implement the provisions of KRS 367.372, et seq., as to the sale of goods and services, and do hereby Order and Direct that:

- No person, within the meaning of KRS 446.010, shall sell or offer to sell any good or service delineated in KRS 367.374(1)(b) at a price grossly in excess of the price prior to the declaration by Executive Order 2022-457 on July 28, 2022, that a Statewide State of Emergency exists in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- 2. The foregoing is subject to the qualifications and limitations set forth otherwise in KRS 367.372, et seq., with regard to increased cost to sellers inter alia.
- 3. Any person who violates the provisions of KRS 367.372, et seq., as implemented by this Order, shall be subject to the penalties set forth in KRS 367.378 or other applicable law.
- 4. The Division of Emergency Management shall immediately notify the public and those registered with the Division for the purpose of receiving notice of the implementation, renewal, or termination of the provision of this Order relating to KRS 367.374. The Division shall notify the public by any means available, including the Division's Web site, news media, and electronic mail. Any person

or trade association may register with the Division for the purpose of receiving notification.

This Order shall be effective on July 28, 2022. This Order shall be in effect for the duration of the State of Emergency herein referenced and shall be subject to renewal thereafter if necessary to protect the lives, property, or welfare of the citizens of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

STATE OF EMERGENCY

Beginning on July 26, 2022, a severe weather system generating multiple rounds of heavy torrential rain, creating flooding, flash flooding, mudslides, and landslides impacted the Commonwealth of Kentucky, creating dangerous conditions and damage to public infrastructure, utility distribution systems, and private properties.

These conditions endanger public health and safety and public and private property;

The severe weather system took the lives of 39 Kentuckians and left hundreds of our citizens without their homes and belongings. The flooding caused hundreds of millions of dollars in property and infrastructure damage, leaving mud and debris that must be removed so rebuilding can begin;

State and local governments share responsibility for the protection of public health, safety, and security, as well as for the protection of public and private property and for taking appropriate actions to ensure the provision of essential public services;

On July 28, 2022, I signed Executive Order 2022-457, declaring a state of emergency in the Commonwealth of Kentucky under the Kentucky Constitution and KRS Chapter 39A. The next day, the President of the United States declared that a major disaster exists in the Commonwealth and ordered federal aid to supplement state and local recovery efforts;

Subsequently, I signed related emergency orders relating to price gouging (Executive Orders 2022-460 and 2022-504), the dispensing of pharmaceuticals (Executive Order 2022-463), unemployment insurance claims and benefits (Executive Order 2022-471), and the suspension of certain statutory fees for duplicate state-issued operator's licenses, instruction permits, personal identification cards, and motor vehicle registrations and certificates of title (Executive Order 2022-473 and 2022-512);

Under KRS 39A.090(2)(b), the state of emergency declared under Executive Order 2022-457 and subsequent executive orders set forth above may exceed 30 days if requested by a chief executive officer or a legislative body of a local government, only for that local government and only for the period of time requested by the chief executive officer or legislative body; and

Thirty-three County Judge/Executives, two Mayors of consolidated local governments, and three city Mayors have written letters requesting that I extend through January 15, 2023, Executive Order 2022-457 and the subsequent executive orders relating to price gouging, the dispensing of pharmaceuticals, unemployment insurance claims and benefits, and the suspension of certain statutory fees for duplicate state-issued operator's licenses, instruction permits, personal identification cards, and motor vehicle registrations and certificates of title. These letters are attached to this executive order and are adopted and incorporated by reference herein;
