Per 49 CFR 383.71 of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations all commercial license/permit holders/applicants are required to have a valid Medical Examiner's Certificate or federal/state medical waiver, Self-Certification, and Commercial Driver License application on file with the Department of Vehicle Regulation, Division of Driver Licensing, prior to commercial permit/license issuance.

You can locate a Certified Medical Examiner by logging into the website at <u>Nationalregistry.fmcsa.dot.gov</u> and search for one in your area. If you pass the medical examination, the medical examiner will issue you a Medical Examiner's Certificate, MCSA 5876.

You can submit your Medical Examiner's Certificate, Self-Certification form and Commercial Driver License application through the Kentucky CDL Document Portal at <u>http://mycdl.ky.gov</u> and you will receive an email when your documents are received. You will receive a separate email when your CDLIS driving record has been updated. You will also receive an immediate email should your document be rejected.

If you do not have access to the KY CDL Document Portal, you may print a copy of the Self-Certification form and Commercial Driver License application from our website at <u>http://drive.ky.gov</u> and submit those by mail along with the Medical Examiner's Certificate, MCSA 5876. The address is Division of Driver Licensing, 200 Mero St, Frankfort, KY 40622. If you submit your documents by mail, you will receive a letter in a few days. However, no letters are mailed if documents are unacceptable.

Once the information has been received, the Commercial Driver License Section will review the medical certificate for authenticity and may contact your certified medical examiner for verification and/or additional information. Once your medical certificate, self-certification, and commercial driver application are verified, your driving record will be updated. You will then be eligible to apply for a commercial permit/ license at any KYTC Driver Licensing Regional office.

The issuance office cannot enter your information. The driver is solely responsible to provide the required documents to the Division of Driver Licensing. If any of the required documents are missing or not legible, you will not be eligible for commercial permit/license issuance.

All Kentucky commercial license/permit applicants/holders are required to have a Certified Medical Examiner's Certificate, MCSA 5876, completed by a National Registry Certified Medical Examiner.

Do we have your current address? If not, it is vital that you provide it. Otherwise, you will not receive important updates and information concerning your commercial license/permit status and requirements.

KRS 186-540 states that a driver has ten (10) days to update the address.
